




Wisconsin Ties to the American Revolution

The series explores both the virtues and contradictions of the revolution and the enduring questions it raised.

The American Revolution collection on PBS LearningMedia will be released in full ahead of the film's premiere in November. It encompasses both well-known and lesser-known topics related to the era and is designed to address a range of skills, standards, and grade levels. 
